



Stay Current with Custom RSS Feeds from ERIC

ERIC's custom RSS feeds can be an indispensable tool in support of ongoing research. Any ERIC search can become a custom RSS feed. By subscribing to your search through RSS, you can be alerted to new content matching your search criteria as it is added to ERIC.

To set up a custom RSS feed, run your search from either the Basic or Advanced Search form. On the search results page, click the RSS icon  located just above the first search result. The RSS client within your browser defines the available subscription options, which vary from browser to browser.

New materials are added to the ERIC Web site several times each week. When using an RSS client with settings for update frequency, a setting of "daily" or "every 24 hours" is recommended.
